8 Reasons Why Reading is Important

1. Kids who read often and widely get better at it. This is pretty much just common sense. After all, practice makes perfect in almost everything we humans do and reading is no different.

2. Reading exercises our brains. Reading strengthens brain connections and actually builds new connections.

3. Reading improves concentration. If they read regularly as they grow up, they develop the ability to do this for longer and longer periods.

4. Reading teaches children about the world around them. Through reading, they learn about people, places and events outside their own experience. They are exposed to ways of life, ideas and beliefs about the world which may be different from those which surround them.

5. Reading improves a child's vocabulary, leads to more highly-developed language skills and improves the child's ability to write well. This is because children learn new words as they read but also because they unconsciously absorb information as they read about things like how to structure sentences and how to use words and language effectively.

6. Reading develops a child's imagination. This is because when we read our brains translate the descriptions we read of people, places and things into pictures. When we're engaged in a story, we're also imagining how the characters are feeling. We use our own experiences to imagine how we would feel in the same situation.

7. Because reading does all the things I've mentioned above, children who read do better at school. And they don't just do better at subjects like reading, English and history. They do better at all subjects and they do better all the way through school.

8. Reading is a great form of entertainment! A paperback book doesn't take up much space so you can take it anywhere and you'll never be lonely or bored if you have a book in your bag.

Math and Digital Literacy

Mathies.ca is a website, hosted by the Ontario Association for Mathematics Education (OAME), designed for Ontario K – 12 students and parents. There are interactive games, learning tools, activities, and additional supports for children <u>and</u> parents to discover in order to develop and enrich their math skills and comprehension. It is organized into sections, as follows:

Interactive Games

There are engaging and educational games to play print and download in this section.



Learning Tools

Here, there are a large variety of tools to help build mathematical thinking such as various calculators, comparison tools, fraction strips, virtual manipulatives, Geometer's Sketchpad, interactive online simulations (called GIZMOS), money, number charts to name just a few.

Activities

This section includes a wide range of math activities according to topic and grade.



Additional Supports

In this section, ePractice is a series of digital interactive mathematics activities designed to practice and build understanding. Immediate feedback is provided.

There are other resources here, as well, such as *Homework Help* and *Ask a Tutor*.
